Specification: Basketball Goal Standard

- 1. All basketball goals must be submitted for approval to Elite for the DRC (Design Review Committee) to review. Any goal installed without approval is subject to removal, but can be allowed if the basketball goal is submitted for review and it meets the Basketball Goal Standard and is approved by the DRC.
- 2. Fixed goals must meet the following criteria:
 - a. The goal must be able to be removed at the ground level.
 - b. The backboard must be transparent, either clear acrylic or tempered glass. The DRC would have to approve any alternative.
 - c. The goal must be maintained in a good state of repair, including the rim and net.
 - d. The pole must be steel or hard plastic and maintained to prevent rust or peeling paint.
 - e. Goalrilla brand goals are an example of an acceptable fixed goal structure as long as the backboard complies.
- 3. Portable goals are discouraged, but can be allowed if the standards of 2b, 2c, and 2d, are met and approved by the DRC. The portable basketball goal must be stored out of sight from the view of the street when not being used for play.
- 4. Children's toy plastic basketball goals are exempt from the Basketball Goal Standard and must be stored out of sight from the view of the street when not being used for play.
